Two new voter contact applications were introduced. "Hustle" allows volunteers to text voters while keeping their cell phone numbers private. "VoterCircle" is a a friend-to-friend email outreach program that matches one's contacts to the political districts where they live and makes it possible to target persuasion and GOTV messages.

#### **Hill Country April Luncheon**



At the April luncheon meeting of Hill Country TDW, we were proud to announce campaign contributions to women candidates including Kim Olson for Commissioner of Agriculture, Stephanie Ertel for State Representative District 53, Stephanie Phillips for State Representative District 73 and five female candidates for places on the Fourth Court of Appeals in San Antonio. Our speaker was Pamela Haylock, PhD, RN, an expert in oncology nursing, who opened our eyes to the politics of cancer. The political issues around cancer go far beyond funding cuts in President Trump's proposed budget and threats to Medicare, Medicaid and the Affordable Care Act from the Republican-controlled Congress. Dr. Haylock is a champion for cancer survivors. She traced many of the failures of our

healthcare system to a culture of self-reliance and opposition to the concept of providing health care to all Americans as a right. She stressed the need for advocacy to support cancer patients facing the legal, economic and discrimination issues associated with cancer treatment and survivorship. Dr. Haylock currently teaches in the Sul Ross State University Nursing Program in Alpine and Uvalde, and serves as President of the local chapter of AAUW.
