Chair Resigns

MollyBeth Malcomb, state party chair, gave her letter of resignation to become effective October 25, 2003. Citing family obligations, she is leaving during her third term. MollyBeth served as president of TDW from 1997 to 1999 when she was elected state party chair. She has been and continues to be an avid supporter and member of TDW. We thank her for her tireless efforts and wish her and her family well.

An interim chair will be appointed on October 25th to serve out the unexpired term. The State Democratic Executive Committee is responsible for this appointment. When the term expires in June 2004, delegates at the State Convention will then elect a party chair to serve a new term.

The list of names of those who are seeking the nomination continues to grow. Included in that list are: Sherry Boyles, Gary Mauro, David Van Os, Charles Soechting, Senator Carl Parker, Representative Garnet Coleman, and Mary Moore. The rules allow candidates to write their names in as late as the day of the meeting. Despite the fact Texas Democratic Women has two places on the SDEC, we do not have a vote because we are "Add-on" members. Although Texas Democratic Women does not endorse any candidate, we do encourage you to contact your SDEC member to let her or him know your position on whom you believe will serve our party best. TDW Well-Received at Women's Conference

On October 1, TDW had a table at the Texas Conference for Women. This is an annual event sponsored by Rick and Anita Perry. This year's speakers included Governor Perry and Karen Hughes. TDW had its table near the speaker's hall and received a great deal of interest. We gave out over 400 brochures and took down nearly 100 names of women who were interested in receiving more information. During the Governor's speech, he told his audience how he valued women, children, and education. We noticed, coincidentally, shortly thereafter the foot traffic out of the hall and towards our table increased. Women commented that they were happy to see us at the conference. They questioned Perry's ability to stand up before the audience and speak such lies. *The women we spoke to said they had had enough! So have we. So have we.*

TDW Co-Sponsors Successful Campaign Camp



Texas Democratic Women co-sponsored the Texas Democratic party's 2003 Campaign Camp in Dallas September 19-21, 2003, conducted by Grassroots Solutions of Washington, D.C. The training program covered three tracks: *Introduction to Management for Future Paid Professionals*, for those who want to be staff on a campaign within two years; *Management for Political Veterans*, to give your election team the modern management fundamentals to be successful at the grassroots level; and *How to be a Better Candidate*, an introduction and preparation for a run at elected office. Each session was lead by a top political consultant, some from national firms and some from Texas.

The Camp sold out prior to the event and had a waiting list. It drew a wide audience including elected officials, activists, labor, and other women's political organizations. Attendees praised the Camp as being invaluable for the thorough approach. After participants listened to the lecture portion, they had the opportunity to practice what they had just learned through exercises that reinforced the discussions. These included: writing and giving a stump speech; writing and filming a TV commercial; writing a press release; preparing a campaign budget; and meeting a crisis. All of the attendees were then given notebooks with extensive materials covering the subjects presented.



Goals Defined at TDW Retreat

In July members of TDW met in Galveston for our annual retreat. Galveston County TDW worked very hard to put on this beautiful, well-coordinated event, complete with organized work sessions, good food, good friends, and a little time for socializing.

During the work sessions we had the opportunity to learn about the diversity and history of TDW. This is critical when your task is to set goals for the organization. With the help of a moderator we set out some major goals for TWD. We then broke into groups assigned a particular goal and brain-stormed on how best to achieve the stated goal.
