Attendees to the July 14th the 2006 TDW Retreat at the Fredonia Hotel and Convention Center began with a meet and greet for the attendees. Host chapter President Anita Farr of Nacogdoches chapter welcomed the attendees, followed by TDW State President, Alieca Hux introducing the evening speakers Texas Democratic Party Chair, Boyd Richie and Regional Field Director and Hopkins County Chair Bill Brannon.

Chairman Richie spoke to thank all members of TDW for their contributions to the Texas Democratic Party. He also provided updates on the DeLay lawsuit, development of TDP Financial plans, and the slow but improving coverage by the media on Democratic events. This included using available tools such as the VAN (voter) database that can focus efforts to voters on the sometime voter turn out to show up to the polls on election day.
