Ann Richards

September 31, 1933. Died Austin, Texas September 13, 2006)

Her political career began in 1976 as a member of the Travis County Commissioners Court. After which she became the first woman in 50 years elected to state office, in 1982 as State Treasurer for which she served 2 terms. Then in 1991 she was the first woman elected as Texas Governor and worked the next 4 years in building the "New Texas".

Thank you Governor for your service to Texas and the nation. You will be missed, but will remain an inspiration to all women.

A Big TEXAS Congratulations to Senator Letícía Van de Putte

During the National Conference of State Legislatures' (NCSL) 2006 annual meeting Senator Van de Putte (Texas District 26) was elected to become the first Texas legislator and first Hispanic to lead the organization as President.

NCSL is a bipartisan organization that provides a forum where legislators can share ideas and develop ideas for identifying and solving problems that face the country.

In her capacity as president-elect of NCSL, Senator Van de Putte has already facilitated a bipartisan task force on immigration reform. Although Immigration is under federal jurisdiction it affects state governments, especially in Texas. This forum allowed state legislators to form consensus policy as debate continues on a federal level.

- The Democrats won 5 seats in the Texas House. The Democrats kicked down the door! (Counting Donna Howard it is 6 in '06).
- \Rightarrow This was won on the Republicans redistricting turf.
- \Rightarrow The Democrats held on to EVERY incumbent Democratic seat!

 $\Rightarrow~$ In January, Republicans will have lost more than half of their majority. Four years ago, Republicans had a 13-vote majority in the Texas House. Now it is six.

 \Rightarrow Every Democrat on the Dallas County ticket won!

 \Rightarrow It is the first time that an African American has become District Attorney in Dallas County and he won on the Democratic ticket

⇒ Hayes and Travis County went Democratic

 \Rightarrow Chet Edwards won his congressional seat with almost 60% of the vote. George W. Bush has a Democratic Congressman. Congressman Edwards represents Crawford, Texas.

- ⇒ Rick Perry won with 60% of Texans not approving of his governorship
- \Rightarrow Nick Lampson won the congressional seat held by Tom DeLay
- \Rightarrow Democrats have the first female Speaker of the House of Representatives.

 $\Rightarrow~$ Straight Democratic voting in the 10 top Texas counties by population was more than the GOP on election day.
